

Accommodations—Gifted

- _ Encourage students to explore concepts in depth and encourage independent studies or investigations.
- _ Use thematic instruction to connect learning across the curriculum.
- _ Encourage creative expression and thinking by allowing students to choose how to approach a problem or assignment.
- _ Expand students' time for free reading.
- _ Invite students to explore different points of view on a topic of study and compare the two.
- _ Provide learning centers where students are in charge of their learning.
- _ Brainstorm with gifted children on what types of projects they would like to explore to extend what they're learning in the classroom.
- _ Determine where students' interests lie and capitalize on their inquisitiveness.
- _ Refrain from having them complete more work in the same manner.
- _ Employ differentiated curriculum to keep interest high.
- _ Avoid drill and practice activities.
- _ Ask students' higher level questions that require students to look into causes, experiences, and facts to draw a conclusion or make connections to other areas of learning.
- _ If possible, compact curriculum to allow gifted students to move more quickly through the material.
- _ Encourage students to make transformations- use a common task or item in a different way.
